# Information Regarding Sport Selections Process Each Term

At Baulkham Hills High School we aim to offer a range of both grade and recreational sports on a Wednesday afternoon so that all students that are participating are able to be involved in an activity that they find engaging and challenging.

Grade sport is where students will trial for a wide variety of sports, in the hope to be selected and represent the school against other schools within our local area.

Recreational sport is for students who are not selected in any grade sport teams, and have the option of choosing from a variety of sports within the local area. We are constantly reviewing the sports that we offer and aim to keep the costs to a minimum. Sports that involve a transport cost are more expensive than venue only or school based sports. We also provide walking as an option which does not involve any costs. One constant question is the high cost of transport – unfortunately buses are quite expensive, and are arranged to best suit our needs. We endeavour to keep this cost as low as possible, but we are restricted by the bus company.

When choosing our sports & venues we are restricted by the numbers that a venue can accommodate or the number that an instructor can safely instruct.

We face some challenges in the number of students who can attend each sport, including; physical space in the school, and also the number of students that are permitted to travel on a bus to and from the venue. Another challenge is that we are restricted by the number of teachers allocated to Wednesday sport each week, due to timetable constraints, as well as ensuring that all activities adhere to strict safety guidelines. As a result our sports do have limited numbers & the most popular sports will fill up quickly and once full become unavailable.

Our recreational sport selections are made online in order to give all students an equal and fair chance at choosing the sport that they would like to enrol in. The server that we use seems to have no issues with the traffic that is involved with hundreds of bookings successfully made in the first couple of minutes after the site opens.

We are looking at opening the site for bookings at 6pm in the future rather than 2:30pm, as they have been previously. With bookings now becoming increasingly made by parents rather than students this may be away that we can alleviate some of the concerns expressed regarding the bookings process.

We also need to ensure that both students and parents understand that for the school to adhere to safety guidelines, each time a student is selected in a sport (either grade or recreational), a permission note must be completed, with up to date medical and contact information to ensure your child's safety is paramount at all times.

For students who wish to stay as up to date as possible with all sports announcements, please enrol in the Sports Google classroom, the code is: **mcdzkp** 

Just a friendly reminder that the sports office is located in D Block, NOT the PDHPE staffroom.

If at any time parents or students have a question in relation to sport, please do not hesitate to contact the school.

**UCAT** has now replaced UMAT as the **admissions test** for entry into medical, dental and clinical science degree programmes in Australia and New Zealand.

University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT ANZ)

The <u>University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT)</u> is an admissions test used by the UCAT ANZ Consortium of universities in Australia and New Zealand for their medical, dental and clinical science degree programmes.



26 February 2019

The UCAT ANZ test will replace the UMAT (Undergraduate Medicine and Health Sciences Admission Test) from 2019 (for university entry in 2020). The test helps universities to select applicants with the most appropriate abilities and professional behaviours required for new doctors and dentists to be successful in their clinical careers. It is used in collaboration with other admissions processes such as interviews and academic qualifications. It is also an opportunity to stand out from other applicants and demonstrate aptitude for a demanding programme of study. The UCAT ANZ is a computer-based test delivered in Pearson VUE test centres throughout Australia, New Zealand and at some overseas locations. Please note that some pathways to medicine / dentistry / clinical sciences will not require the UCAT. For some applicants a different test may be required. For details candidates should refer to the websites of the universities to which they intend to apply.

### UAC admissions opening early

If you're a Year 12 student in NSW, or an interstate student planning on applying in 2020 to a Uni in NSW through <u>UAC</u>, there's some good news.

You can now start the undergraduate admissions process from 9am on 3 April 2019 (in previous years you had to wait until August). So if you know what you want to study and where, you could get your Uni applications done early in the Year, leaving more time to focus on study near to your exams.

You could also take some time now to check with the <u>NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA)</u> that the information they have about you on their database is correct.

Your full and correct name, as well as your correct and current email address are the most important details. It will enable NESA to communicate your results and other important information to you, and save time and stress later down the Uni applications track.
