Absences

- If you are absent, you are required to bring a note signed and dated by your parent or guardian within 7 days to explain your absence upon your return to school (Parents can now make use of the school app to send absence notes to the office).
- In the event of a prolonged absence, your parent or guardian should notify the school after three days.
- If you know you are going to be absent, bring a note in advance to the Rolls Office.
- If a student is marked absent from roll call, an automated system will notify parents via SMS. If you are unaware of your child's absence, please telephone the school immediately. It is important that the student's name is marked off in roll call otherwise an incorrect message may be sent.
- A computer record of each student's attendance is retained and letters are sent out when students fail to bring notes. A record of unexplained absences and late days may produce an unsatisfactory record for the School Certificate or Higher School Certificate.

Late to School

- If you arrive late you must report to the Rolls Office where you will need to scan your ID card to receive a late slip, part of which you will take home for a parent signature or bring a note/medical certificate with you to give to Office Staff.
- You will not be admitted to class without a late slip.

Need to Leave the School Grounds during or before the end of the day

- Students who need to leave school early for an unavoidable appointment must present a note signed by the parent/guardian, to the Rolls Office **BEFORE ROLL CALL**. You will then need to scan your ID card to receive your Early Leaver Slip and place it in the tray at the Rolls Office for collection at time of departure. **Students are not to miss school for external exams such as music and ballet.** These must be arranged for weekends.

NSW SCHOOL VACCINATION PROGRAM – SCHOOL NEWSLETTER TO PARENTS/GUARDIANS

Each year NSW Health works in partnership with schools to offer the vaccines recommended by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) for adolescents as part of the school vaccination program.

In 2019 the following vaccines will be offered:

YEARS	VACCINE	NUMBER OF DOSES
Year 7	Human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine	2-doses at least 6 months apart
	Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (whooping cough) vaccine	Single dose
Year 10	Meningococcal ACWY vaccine	Single dose

Parent Information Kits that include an information sheet, consent form and privacy statement will be sent home to you by your child's school. To consent to the vaccination of your child, parents/guardians are advised to:

- read all the information provided;
- complete the consent form, including signing your name next to each of the vaccine/s you would like your child to receive;
- return the completed consent form to your child's school;
- ensure that your child eats breakfast on the day of the school vaccination clinic.

Parents/guardians who wish to withdraw consent for any reason may do so by writing to the school Principal or phone the school. The Procedure for Withdrawal of Consent is available on the NSW Health website at www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation.

To improve vaccination completion, students will be opportunistically offered any missed vaccine/s throughout the year where possible.

Please note that students who commence the HPV vaccination in school clinics in Year 7 but do not complete the course during the school year may be offered a catch-up dose at school in Year 8. Students who have their first HPV dose at their GP will be advised to complete the course with their GP.

A Record of Vaccination will be provided to each student vaccinated at each clinic. You should ensure that this record is kept for future reference. Please do not assume that your child has been vaccinated if you do not receive this Record of Vaccination. Vaccination records will be uploaded to the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) to provide a complete immunisation history for your child.

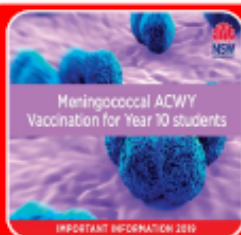

Please note there are 2 temporary bus stops on Foxall Rd on both sides near Lansdowne Rd for students.





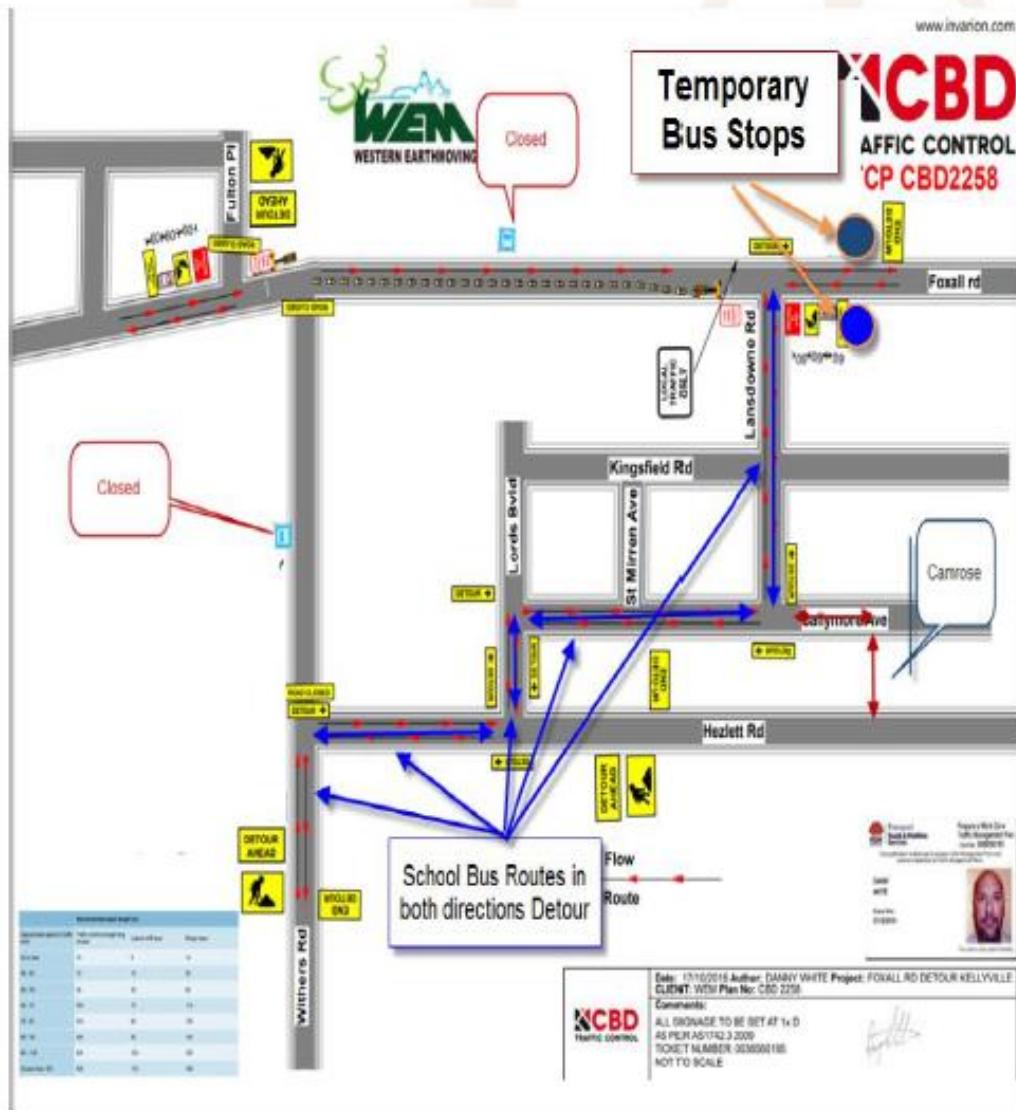
