Future Project – Scientific Research

Over the past term, we have had the privileged opportunity of conducting original scientific research to examine the effectiveness of various DNA extraction methods for accurately diagnosing pneumonia in pastoral sheep. Pneumonia is a significant cost to the sheep industry, as affected meat must be trimmed before being sold for consumption, and it has been rewarding to be able to contribute to research in such an important field.

We have been able to use the professional facilities of The King's School for our research, meeting with our researcher Dr Joan Lloyd every Wednesday afternoon. We also attended a four-day block of full-time research during the Easter holidays to conduct the bulk of our experiments. Through the process, we have learnt various specialised pipetting techniques and used sophisticated equipment to come to valid results which we will be



compiling into a report for the Future Project Journal later this year. Other students have been pursuing scientific research in areas such as microbial ecosystems, the classification of blood plasma, and advances in food safety technology.

It has been great fun, as well as a valuable learning experience, to put scientific theory into practise with real experiments. We are grateful to the King's School for the opportunity to conduct research alongside almost thirty other students from Western Sydney, and look forward to the year of science ahead!

2019 National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN)

Tuesday 14th May to Friday 17th May will see students from Years 7 and 9 across Australia take part in the testing for the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy.

The NAPLAN test is another way of finding out what students can and cannot do, so that future programs can help them. It should be noted that there is no pass/fail mark in the tests, the NAPLAN tests is purely an indication of what an individual student can do.

As the test is marked mainly by computer the test must be completed using a pencil and an eraser, under no circumstances should a student use pens or liquid paper. We advise students to bring to the exam:

- at least two sharpened 2B pencils, not mechanical pencils such as *Pacers*
- a pencil sharpener, with something to collect the shavings in
- an eraser
- a calculator for the Numeracy Test
- some quiet activity to go on with if they should finish early, all other equipment for the test will be supplied.

Why do students do NAPLAN?

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assesses literacy and numeracy skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life.

Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in the annual NAPLAN tests in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

The assessment provides parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process - it does not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance.

NAPLAN also provides schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working and whether young Australians are meeting important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy.

What is assessed?

NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through their regular school curriculum. All government and non-government education authorities have contributed to the development of NAPLAN materials.

How can I help my child prepare?

Help your child prepare by reassuring them that NAPLAN is just one part of their school program, and by reminding them on the day to simply try their best. Teachers will ensure students are familiar with the types of questions in the tests and will provide appropriate support and guidance.

ACARA does not recommend excessive preparation for NAPLAN or the use of services by coaching providers.

NAPLAN is about assessing learning progress in literacy and numeracy.

Participation in NAPLAN

All students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 are expected to participate in the annual NAPLAN assessment.

Students with disability may qualify for adjustments that reflect the support normally provided for classroom assessments. You should first discuss the use of any disability adjustments for your child with your child's teacher.

A formal exemption may be granted for a student with disability that severely limits their capacity to participate in the assessment, or for a student who has recently arrived in Australia and has a non-English speaking background.

Your school principal and your local test administration authority can give you more information on special provisions or the process required to gain a formal exemption.

Will my child sit NAPLAN on paper or online?

In 2019, your child will sit NAPLAN paper tests.

However, children in other schools across Australia will sit the NAPLAN online tests this year. Federal, state and territory education ministers have agreed that all schools will move online by 2020. State and territory education authorities will determine when their schools move online.

As students are assessed on the same literacy and numeracy curriculum content, regardless of whether they complete the test online or on paper, results for both formats can be reported on the same NAPLAN assessment scale. To find out more about NAPLAN Online, visit nap.edu.au

What if my child is absent from school on assessment days?

Where possible, schools may arrange for individual students who are absent at the time of testing to complete missed tests at another time during the testing week. Individual students are not permitted to sit tests after Friday 17 May 2019.

How is my child's performance measured?

Individual student performance is shown on a national achievement scale for each test. A result at the national minimum standard indicates that the student has demonstrated the basic literacy and numeracy skills needed to participate fully in that year level.

A NAPLAN individual student report will be issued by your child's school later in the year. If you do not receive a report, you should contact your child's school.

How are NAPLAN results used?

- Students and parents may use individual results to discuss progress with teachers.
- Teachers use results to better identify students who would benefit from greater challenges or extra support.
- Schools use results to identify strengths and areas to improve in teaching programs, and to set goals in literacy and numeracy.
- School systems use results to review programs and support offered to schools.
- The community can see average school NAPLAN results at myschool.edu.au

Pindone Rabbit baiting in The Hills Shire Parks and Reserves

The Hills Shire Council in conjunction with Local Land Services is co-ordinating a rabbit baiting program in Council's parks and reserves. Grazing by the European Rabbit has a major impact on our environment. This program aims to protect native flora, and reduce the amount of damage to grassed areas.

The program is undertaken as per the Pesticide Control (Pindone Products) Order 2010. This process involves an initial preparation period where non-poison carrot is laid. This allows measurement of the existing rabbit population. Carrots baited with Pindone poison will then be placed in each reserve on three evenings during the advertised period. Any residual carrot baits will be removed the following mornings.

This rabbit baiting program will run from Monday 13th May to Thursday 18th June 2019.

The following reserves will be closed to all people and their pets during these following periods:

- midday the 13th May (Monday), to midday 14th May (Tuesday) 2019;
- and midday 16th May (Thursday), to midday 17th May (Friday) 2019;
- and midday 20th May (Monday), to midday 21st May (Tuesday) 2019.

The pesticide is lethal to dogs and cats and if consumed can cause illness to humans. Contact your local vet or seek medical advice in the case of suspected poisoning.

Reserves participating in this program are Bella Vista Farm, Bella Vista; Castle Hill Cemetery, Castle Hill; Eric Mobbs Reserve, Baulkham Hills.

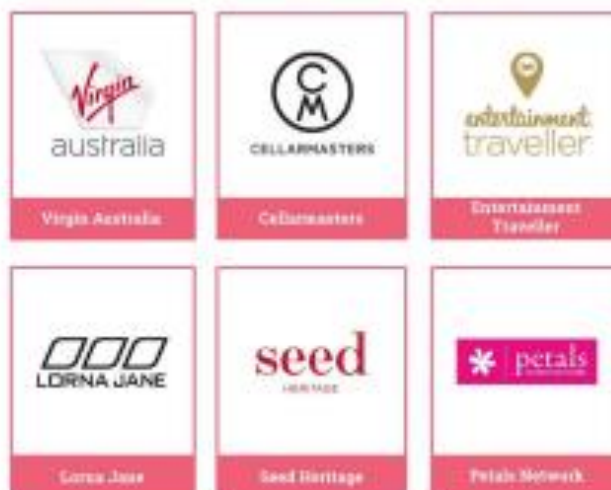

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
