Welcome to our new String ensemble Conductor, Ms Jacqui Carias

Australian-Salvadoran violinist Jacqui Carias is a graduate from the Elder Conservatorium of Music, where she studied under the guidance of Wendy Heiligenberg and Keith Crellin. Jacqui furthered her studies and completed a postgraduate performance diploma with Dr Goetz Richter at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music and has also participated in self-organised study trips to the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland and the Royal Academy of Music in London

Jacqui is a recipient of scholarship awards from the Australian Cultural Fund and the Independent Arts foundation of South Australia which have enabled her music travels. Jacqui has played with a number of orchestras in South Australia, ACT and NSW including the former Adelaide Art Orchestra, Philharmonia Australia, George Ellis Orchestra and Canberra Symphony Orchestra and is also regularly engaged as an orchestral player for major choirs in Adelaide including Adelaide Graduate Singers, Adelaide Harmony choir and Adelaide Philharmonia Chorus. In 2018 Jacqui performed with Philharmonie der Animato Stiftung in Austria, Czech Republic, Hungary & Slovakia. In March 2019, Jacqui was concertmaster for the Australian International Opera Company Tour to China.

In early 2019, Jacqui's recording of Schumann's Fantasiestucke was licensed for a Canadian Netflix film and premiering around October of 2019.

In addition to her classical music performance, Jacqui has a particular interest in authentic tango performance which has taken her to Buenos Aires to study with La Orquesta Escuela de Emilio Balcarce and performs regularly with Tango Oz and La Orquesta de Luna with Daniel Rojas Gonzales.



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Jacqui was also recently awarded with a recognition diploma from the embassy of Mexico and El Salvador for 'inspirational talent in the Latin American community of Australia'.

Updates for parents of Year 12 students

- UAC Guides have been delivered to the school and are available in the senior study for all Year 12 students. Year 12 have been briefed on uni procedures and are now able to apply (the full <u>timeline</u> has been sent to students)
- Scholarship and cadetship opportunities have been emailed to/posted on Google Classroom for students and addressed by universities and other speakers this term

Cough etiquette

Cover your cough



- When coughing or sneezing, use a tissue to cover your nose and mouth
- · Dispose of the tissue afterwards
- If you don't have a tissue, cough or sneeze into your elbow.

Wash your hands



- After coughing, sneezing or blowing your nose, wash your hands with soap and water
- Use alcohol-based hand cleansers if you do not have access to soap and water

Remember hand washing is the single most effective way to reduce the spread of germs that cause respiratory disease.

Anyone with signs and symptoms of a respiratory infection, regardless of the cause, should be instructed to cover their nose/mouth when coughing or sneezing; use tissues to contain respiratory secretions; dispose of tissues in the nearest waste receptacle after use; and wash their hands afterwards.

Does your child catch a school bus? Help them keep it!

As the bus operator that providing your child's school bus services, we're asking for your help getting your child to use their Opal card on every bus trip.

Since the introduction of the School Opal card in 2016, school bus patronage data has significantly dropped. This is not reflected in the number of students actually travelling on our buses for various reasons a large number of students are consistently not using their Opal cards as they should be.

Opal data gathered by tapping on and off is used by transport planners and service schedulers to design the bus network that best serves the community utilising the resources available.

If students don't tap on and off then school bus services will appear underutilised and may be considered for cancellation based on low passenger numbers.

Please help us reinforce the message that tapping on and off every bus journey with an Opal card is essential to travel on the bus. This will ensure school services continue to be planned for the students that use it, providing the journey to school your children depend on.

To help us achieve this, please talk with your child:

- · Ask them if they tap on and off the bus with their Opal card.
- If they do, congratulate them for doing the right thing and talk about why it's important.
- If they sometimes don't or never do, ask them why.
 - Are they confused about why they have to? Talk about why it's important, and that every tap tells the bus planners that the bus is needed.
 - Do they forget? Help them find a way to remember, such as getting into the habit of getting their Opal card out as soon as they arrive at the bus stop or bus line.
 - o Is their Opal card at the bottom of their bag? Help find a handier place to keep it.
 - Are they influenced by friends or peers that don't tap? Talk about how they like to travel on the bus with their friends and how tapping is what keeps the service running.
 - Have they lost their Opal card? To order a new Opal card visit www.opal.com.au.
