From the principal's desk:

Welcome to Week 9. We have two year groups out at camps this week, Years 8 and 10. Thank you to all the teachers who are giving up their home comforts to accompany the students for these end of year celebrations and challenges.

Thank you to all the parents who have completed the community survey. So far we have had responses from 157 parents. That is hardly representative of the 1200 students we teach. The survey will close tonight so please try to share your views, even if negative!

Some points that parents have raised in the survey so far are: lack of contact with teachers ; lack of information about curriculum: poor communication with parents; and counsellors not being available for ongoing treatment. Unfortunately, Covid has meant that there has been limited contact between parents and teachers but teachers have been instructed to make telephone contact with any parents where there is a problem with the student. So if you have not heard from the teachers you can assume your child is progressing well.

Procedure for Early Leavers






myfuture has a new look!

Symptoms of COVID-19

Symptoms of COVID-19 include

- Fever (37.5 ° or higher)
- cough
- sore/scratchy throat
- shortness of breath
- loss of smell or
- loss of taste.

Other reported symptoms include

- fatigue
- runny nose
- muscle pain
- joint pain
- headache
- diarrhoea
- nausea/vomiting
- loss of appetite.

In more severe cases, infection can cause pneumonia with severe acute respiratory distress.

When COVID-19 symptoms appear

The amount of time between exposure to the virus and the first appearance of symptoms is usually 5 to 6 days, although it may range from 2 to 14 days.

People who might have been in contact with someone who is confirmed to have COVID-19 should <u>self-isolate</u> for 14 days.

You should prevent the spread of viruses, by keeping your <u>hands clean</u>, not touching your face and <u>keeping your distance</u> from other people.
