We will try, once again, to hold our school Swimming Carnival on Friday this week. If you have already returned a permission note there is no need to send another. All students are encouraged to attend and support their sporting house. It is considered a normal school day in terms of attendance.

Fee sheets are in the process of being emailed to families in coming days. Your prompt settlement of these fees is appreciated. The school develops a budget for the year in the expectation that all families will meet their obligations. If there are financial reasons why your family cannot meet this obligation please contact Mr Parnaby, our Bursar, to discuss assistance.

Year 11 students are expected to meet a \$200 textbook levy which will be refunded at the end of Year 12 if all textbooks are returned in good order. Students are not being issued textbooks until this levy is received. This levy has come about because in the past students have left the school without returning their textbooks, sometimes involving hundreds of dollars value.

Parents are again reminded that they are not to enter the school carpark, nor park in the bus bay before or after school when buses are in operation. There is an official drop off zone at the bottom of the bus bay but it is difficult to safely access it from 3.00 – 3.45pm. Preferably, parents are asked to drop off/pick up their child in Coronation Road, Chelsea Avenue or Carver Crescent.



Novel Coronavirus Information

Current advice (as at 7 February 2020) from the NSW Government for parents and affected staff is:

- Any student or staff member who has been in, or transited through, mainland China (not just Hubei province) on or after 1 February is excluded from school or child care services for 14 days from the date they left mainland China (as the novel coronavirus' incubation period can be as long as two weeks)
- Any confirmed cases of novel coronavirus will be excluded until they are medically cleared to return
- Close contact of a confirmed case of novel coronavirus will be excluded for 14 days since last contact with the confirmed case

Students who returned to Australia from mainland China more than 14 days ago and have shown no symptoms are able to return to normal school

Council's Compilance Officers enforce parking signs at your school.

When it comes to the safety of vulnerable road users like school children, drivers found breaking the law will be met with zero tolerance. When an offence is detected, you will be fined.



NO STOPPING

You must not STOP at any time. Stopping includes when the vehicle is not moving but the engine is still running.

SCHOOL ZONE Penalty from \$344 and 2 demerit points



HO PARKING

You can step only to drop off or pick up passengers or goods and you must not stop for more than 2 minutes and The driver must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle. Stopping includes when the vehicle is not moving but the engine is still running.

SCHOOL ZONE

Penalty from \$191 and 2 demerit points



BUS ZONES

You must not stop your vehicle in a Bus Zone unless you are driving a public bus. Stopping includes when the vehicle is not moving but the engine is still running.

SCHOOL ZONE Penalty from \$344 and 2 dement points



DRIVEWAYS

You must not park your car over or block access to a driveway. You can stop in a driveway to drop off or pick up passengers BUT only for less than 2 minutes AND the driver must stay with the car.

There are now increased penalties and demerit points associated with all offences in School Zones.



NO PARKING

You have no more than 2 minutes for drop-offs or pick-ups and must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle.

Penalty from \$191 and 2 demerit points



NO STOPPING

Under no cicumstances are you permitted to stop on a length of road to which a No Stopping Sign applies.

Penalty from \$344 and 2 demerit points



BUS ZONE

You must not stop your vehicle in the indicated zone unless you are driving a public bus.

Penalty from \$344 and 2 demerit points

Double parking

Stop on path or nature strip

Stop on / near marked pedestrian/children's crossing

Approach children's crossing too quickly to stop safely

Illegal U turns

Stop across driveway

Drive using a hand held mobile phone

Parallel park close to (within 3 metres) double centre line \$344 & 2 dement points
