Two repeat reminders...



Parent/Guardian Information Sheet – Year 10 Love Bites Program

Year 10 will be partaking in the Love Bites Program on Thursday 24th November at school, as part of the broader Wellbeing Program at Baulkham Hills High School. The program will run for a full day with two interactive sessions followed by creative workshops. Young people are given an opportunity to create their own campaigns to promote respectful relationships in our community through these workshops.

NAPCAN's highly regarded Love Bites and Love Bites Junior programs have been running in schools since 2005. The interactive and engaging sessions focus on the development of respectful relationships for young people aged 11 to 17. The programs aim to provide a safe environment in which young people can discuss and learn about their rights and responsibilities in relationships and look at ways to access support when needed. During the sessions, young people are introduced to a number of services in the community and encouraged to support their friends by utilising safe, healthy and proactive strategies.

The facilitators for the Love Bites program come from different community organisations and services including Local Police and trained Student Support Officers from local schools in the region. Our Staff will also be present during the sessions.

If required, young people can be supported by several support staff who will be present throughout the day, including the SSO, Head Teacher Wellbeing, Counselling Team, Year Advisers and classroom teachers.

If you have any questions or concerns regarding the program, please contact the school. Should you wish to discuss any personal difficulties regarding relationships, please find contact numbers for additional support options below.

If you do not wish your young person to attend this workshop, please provide a note to the office by the 21st November.

PARENT/GUARDIAN INFORMATION FORM YEAR 11 into 12 FLEXIBLE LEAVE & ATTENDANCE REMINDERS

The beginning of Term 4 signals the start of Year 12 and the commencement of HSC courses. Your child may experience timetable changes due to changes in courses they have elected to study. As a result, the privilege of flexible leave may be extended to include both late arrival and early leave.

With this privilege comes added responsibility. Students are required to adhere to several conditions governing the privilege. It is important to understand that the school may remove flexible leave privileges for any student who misuses this privilege or who does not demonstrate responsibility for their school attendance.

Late Arrival Conditions:

Your child may come to school late if they have non-timetabled lessons before recess. The following apply:

- Students MUST SIGN IN at the school front office when they enter school grounds after 8:44 AM.
 - They must ALSO sign in at the library to indicate where they are during study periods.
- Students must arrive at school before the first timetabled class OR before recess, whichever comes first, even if students have a non-timetabled lesson after recess.
 - This is <u>NOT</u> permitted on Mondays, as students MUST attend assembly.
 - This is NOI permitted if students have a Period 0 class (a timetabled lesson before school). Furthermore, students with a Period 0 class must sign in at the school front office between 8:41 AM - 8:44 AM if they do not have a Period 1 timetabled class.

Early Leave Conditions:

Your child may leave the school grounds early if they have non-timetabled lessons after lunch. The following apply:

- Students MUST SIGN OUT at the school front office when they leave school grounds before the end of school.
 - If students leave school grounds without signing out officially, they will be classified as a truant and will lose all flexible leave privileges. 'Forgetting' to sign out is not an adequate excuse.
- Students may leave school during lunch OR after the last timetabled class, whichever comes
 last, even if students have a non-timetabled lesson before lunch.
 - This is NOT permitted if a Year Meeting has been scheduled during or after lunch.
 - This is <u>NOT</u> permitted on Wednesdays if students participate in Sport or have timetabled lessons during Sport.
 - This is <u>NOT</u> permitted if students have a Period 9 class (a timetabled lesson after school).
 In the case of the Period 9 class being cancelled, the teacher in charge of the class must provide advanced notice to the front office in order to allow early leave.

Non-timetabled lessons (study periods):

- Students are NOT permitted to use study periods as an opportunity to leave school grounds.
- Students MUST sign in at the library to indicate which area they will remain in during their study period.
- Students MUST sign out of the library before moving to their next timetabled lesson.

Students who do not follow the above guidelines will be considered partial truants and will be dealt with according to the school's discipline policy.



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ATTENDANCE REMINDERS - LATENESS:

- Your child is expected to be at school on time every day. School begins at 8:40 AM unless your child has a Period 0 class in which their start time is informed by their teacher.
- If your child is late to school, they must sign into the school front office and receive a late slip.
 There are two sections to this slip:
 - The first is to take home to parents/guardians who must sign off on the student being late. This slip must then be returned to the school front office the next school day.
 - The second is to take to the classroom teacher who will then adjust their roll to reflect
 any late attendance. If there is a large discrepancy between the time your child enters
 school and the time they enter class, they will be considered a truant.
- If your child builds up a habit of late days (3 days or as determined by HT Administration), they
 will receive a lunch time detention. Failure to attend the detention will result in further school
 discipline.

ATTENDANCE REMINDERS - ABSENCE:

- Your child is expected to be at school every day. If their attendance percentage goes below a
 certain level, parents/guardians will be contacted. The same may apply if a pattern of
 absence arises (for example, if your child is absent every Friday).
- For every day that your child is absent, parents/guardians must supply a note to the school to
 justify their leave. This note may be a text message to the school on the day of absence or a
 signed note brought in by the student when they next return to school. The school will then
 determine if the absence is justified or unjustified.
- The number of unjustified and unexplained absences will be shown on your child's school academic record. Many employers will look at this data when recruiting new employees.
- If your child builds up a habit of unexplained absences (as determined by HT Administration), they will receive a lunch time detention. Failure to attend the detention will result in further school discipline.

Students who do not demonstrate responsibility for their school attendance will lose the privilege of flexible leave. This includes any form of truancy and frequent lateness/absenteeism.

Parents/guardians who have already given permission for their child to have flexible leave will not need to give permission again this year. Flexible leave privileges are automatically updated with your child's most current timetable on Sentral. If your child drops a subject during the term, they cannot exercise new flexible leave days until the new timetable is reflected on Sentral. If at any stage you wish to change your permission for your child's flexible leave, please email the school.

Baulkham Hills High School has these structures and programs in place to support students in becoming independent and responsible learners. This requires them to self-regulate and prioritise their learning needs. As students learn to work effectively in this setting, they will be in the best possible position to be successful in the flexible tertiary environment and in future workplaces.

Busways has been conducting checks at your school regarding Opal card usage.

Your child did not have an Opal card today when travelling on the school bus.

Opal data gathered by tapping on and off is used to determine demand for bus services. If students don't tap on and tap off then school bus services will appear underutilised and may be considered for cancellation based on low passenger numbers.

Please ensure that your child has a valid Opal card (either a School or Child/Youth Opal card) and taps on and off when travelling to and from school.




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




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School uniform – a reminder

Correct school uniform is expected to be worn at all times by students. If, for any reason, your student is unable to wear school uniform on a particular day, they are required to bring a note from a parent or carer to be sighted and signed by a Deputy Principal before school. The student will be issued a Uniform Pass for the day.

TAFE Use

Students are reminded that the use of the adjacent TAFE facility to walk to and from Old Northern Rd is a privilege and not a right. Students are reminded to walk safely, quietly and quickly thorough the facility. Parents and carers are **not** permitted to enter, drive into, or park in the TAFE to pick up or drop off students.

Bus Travel

The **bus stop on Old Northern Rd in front of Baulkham Hills TAFE** is used each afternoon by approximately 100 students. Students have the privilege and responsibility of accessing this bus stop through the TAFE. I would remind students to be very careful and considerate when using and accessing this bus stop, waiting for a bus, and moving to the kerb to get on a bus. Buses sometimes approach the stop very quickly, with the front of the bus coming over the edge of the kerb. Please always demonstrate courtesy and safety, and remember that there is always another bus.

Student pickup after school

A reminder about parking and picking up around our school in the afternoons, especially in the school bus bay, Carver Crescent, Christopher Street, Coronation Road, and Baulkham Hills TAFE areas.

Please ensure you follow all traffic rules (especially traffic lights and not parking across driveways) when you are in these areas. You could even have your student walk a little but further away from the school gate – to assist their physical health, and alleviate the heavy traffic at the end of the school day.

The Hills Shire Council will have compliance officers at various times in these locations to ensure all drivers are following required traffic rules.
