#### **Mathematical Milestones**

Further to their success earlier in the year in various competitions and Olympiads, Cloris Xu and Iris Xu of Year 10 were invited to represent Australia in the 34th Asian Pacific Mathematics Olympiad (APMO) as two of its ten competitors.

The APMO is an annual mathematical competition for countries in the Pacific-Rim Region, designed to discover, encourage and challenge mathematically gifted high school students. The contest paper consists of a set of five challenging problems to be solved in 4 hours. Of the 35 countries who participated, Australia came 10th in region. Both Cloris and Iris were presented with bronze awards for their achievements in the APMO. A huge congratulations to both girls for their fine performance.

Good news does not stop here, Cloris was selected as a reserve Australian team member for the International Mathematical Olympiad (IMO). The competition took place in Oslo, Norway

over the school holidays, with six contest problems to be solved across two days. Australia ranked 29th out of 104 countries that took part.





The Australian team consisted of six members across the nation and typically comprises of students in their senior years of study in high school. We are incredibly proud that Cloris' mathematical prowess led to her selection as a reserve team member to represent Australia for the 2022 IMO.

Both girls, along with Mohijit Singh of Year 9, have been invited to participate in the AMOC Senior Contest later in August, run by the Australian Maths Trust. We wish them all the best.






### NAIDOC Week at Baulko

Students handed out business cards to staff and students reminding us all, that we learn and grow on Dharug country.





ICAS is an online academic competition that is designed to assess students 'higher order thinking and problem-solving skills in English, Mathematics, Science, Writing, Spelling Bee and Digital Technologies.

Each assessment celebrates students' accomplishments by providing opportunities for recognition and development. Every student who participates will receive a printed certificate and an online results report. Top performers will be eligible for medals.

The test will be run on Wednesday, 24th August Periods 1 & 2.

You and your child can access the results once released via the Reports Portal using the TAP ID and pin found on the back of the ICAS certificate.

I am proud to offer ICAS and look forward to some fantastic results later in the year.

The bus stop on Old Northern Rd in front of Baulkham Hills TAFE is used each afternoon by approximately 100 students. Students have the privilege and responsibility of accessing this bus stop through the TAFE.
