

Street Art with Support Visual Arts


In Visual Arts, students have been diving into the world of Pop Art and street art, discovering the vibrant techniques and unique styles of iconic artists Andy Warhol and Keith Haring. They've been experimenting with stenciling and pattern techniques using a range of mixed media, learning how to create engaging and dynamic compositions.



Through hands-on activities, students are mastering color mixing and developing harmonious and contrasting color schemes to add energy and depth to their work. By exploring the art history behind Pop Art and street art, students gain insight into these movements' origins and cultural significance, while building their own skills in pattern, color, and stencil work to bring their creativity to life. This unit has inspired students to think critically about art practice and explore how they can express themselves through color, composition, and creativity.

They also created unique fish sculptures, where each piece displays distinct patterns and textures.

Collaborative Pop Art-inspired artworks allowed students to experiment with Posca markers, pastels, and coloured pencils, learning about colour theory and composition in a fun, group setting. Additionally, students explored cyanotype (sunprint) techniques in the darkroom, using sunlight to capture striking blue-toned prints.

Medicine Interviews

Some graduated Year 12 students are now receiving offers for Medicine interviews. Congrats to those students who do - it is a huge milestone in the process. This page lists key dates for Medicine, Dentistry and Vet Med courses, including when to expect to be invited to interviews, where relevant. If those dates pass and students have not heard from universities, they can safely move on with their post-school plans. It appears that WSU and Notre Dame have made their interview offers for this year.

The Australian process for Medicine is one of the most competitive in the world and this is largely a good thing. Afterall, we want our doctors to be our best and brightest and it's a career that should be undertaken in earnest. BHHS students are successful each year, but it should be noted that most people become doctors via postgraduate study. Getting straight in from high school is an exceptional circumstance; it is simply the case that many BHHS students are exceptional compared to regular state cohorts.

Support Unit TAFE Courses

Some Support students are gaining offers to Access and some mainstream courses for next year. We will have those by the end of November, most likely. I will be working on putting together fact sheets for parents to help provide guidance about how to tell which students are well-suited and ready for TAFE study. It is certainly not for everyone, but it is also just one experience among others that we help families connect with.

An example of such readiness would be answering yes to the following questions:

- Does your child know their/your address and phone number?
- Do they know their date of birth?
- Do they know what their TAFE course is and what they will be learning about?
- Can they follow instructions written on the board in class?
- Can they work well with groups of students they don't know?
- Can they write or type by themselves?
- Do they like meeting new people?
- Can they travel to and from TAFE independently?
- Can they work/study in an adult environment?

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School Student Travel

School student travel information for parents and students

NSW GOVERNMENT

School Travel Passes

Applications are now open for 2025 School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) travel.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their School Opal card at their nominated postal address from mid-January 2025.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass but have not yet applied need to apply or update their details as soon as possible.

In the Opal network, students should travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their <u>local</u> bus operator to discuss their travel needs.

Students living in rural and regional areas will receive their travel pass from their nominated transport operator. It may be issued via their school or be sent directly to them at home.

Note: some rural and regional operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Terms of Use

Students using School Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the Opal terms of use.

This includes travel within the approved times between 6.30am and 7.00pm from Monday to Friday on school days only. Students must use their Child/Youth Opal card for any travel outside these times.

All students are required to comply with the <u>Student code of conduct</u>. The code of conduct aims to ensure the safety and well-being of school children and other passengers. It is important that parents ensure their child is aware of this, as failure to comply with the code of conduct can result in a suspension from travel.

Travel Concession Cards

For Year 10 to Year 12 Students

Please come to the office to pick up your travel concession card for students 16 years and over.

To be used with a child opal card not the school opal card.

Any items you wish to return/exchange must be done within **ONE** week of purchase. All return/exchange must show receipt as proof of purchase. Administration Updates

Absence Explanations

Parents are required to provide an explanation of absence to the school on the day of absence or <u>within seven (7) days</u> from the first day of any period of absence, **otherwise it will remain unjustified**. If a student is absent for three (3) days or more a <u>Medical Certificate</u> is required.



Application for Extended Leave – Travel

Planned Travel

Planned travel should only be taken during school holidays. Students should be at school every day during school term, from beginning to end. Missing a day here or there may not seem like much, but absences add up. Every day matters and the school is here to support all students in attending and engaging with their learning every day of the term. If your child cannot be at school because they are sick, have a medical appointment, or other reasons, please inform the school of their absence.



TAFE Use

Students are reminded that the use of the adjacent TAFE facility to walk to and from Old Northern Rd is a privilege and not a right. Students are reminded to walk safely, quietly and quickly thorough the facility. Parents and carers are <u>not</u> permitted to enter, drive into, or park in the TAFE to pick up or drop off students.

Student pickup after school

A reminder about parking and picking up around our school in the afternoons, especially in the school bus bay, Carver Crescent, Christopher Street, Coronation Road, and Baulkham Hills TAFE areas.

Please ensure you follow all traffic rules (especially traffic lights and not parking across driveways) when you are in these areas. You could even have your student walk a little but further away from the school gate – to assist their physical health, and alleviate the heavy traffic at the end of the school day.

The Hills Shire Council will have compliance officers at various times in these locations to ensure all drivers are following required traffic rules.

Bus Travel

The bus stop on Old Northern Rd in front of Baulkham Hills TAFE is used each afternoon by approximately 100 students. Students have the privilege and responsibility of accessing this bus stop through the TAFE. I would remind students to be very careful and considerate when using and accessing this bus stop, waiting for a bus, and moving to the kerb to get on a bus. Buses sometimes approach the stop very quickly, with the front of the bus coming over the edge of the kerb. Please always demonstrate courtesy and safety, and remember that there is always another bus.
