UBS Young Women's Leadership Academy 2018

Recently, I was given the opportunity to attend the UBS Young Women's Leadership Academy - an annual four day residential program organised and operated by global investment bank UBS at the Women's College and University of Sydney. The Academy brings together 40 Year 11 students selected from hundreds of applicants to learn from and engage with leaders, youth representatives and social initiatives - ultimately aiming to broaden our understanding of what it means and takes to be a leader. The program took place in the April holidays, and students were billeted at the Women's College at the University of Sydney.



The first day of the Academy was largely spent on getting to know each other, especially as many of the girls did not live in Sydney. We were exposed to the different personality types through the Myers Brigg Type Indicator, and a guest speaker explained what each personality type entailed and how it related to leadership. This was extremely helpful, especially as we were given advice on how to tailor our approach as leaders to people with different personalities, so as to maximise teamwork and output from every individual. The session also helped us understand our different capabilities as leaders, and identify our strengths and weaknesses in how we handled situations.

The Academy also focused on personal branding and presentation as two extremely important aspects of all leaders. Throughout the second day, we participated in various workshops which allowed us to improve our presentation skills as well as cultivate our image and self-perception, ultimately focusing on creating a personal brand with the intention to inspire. This involved many off the cuff pitches and impromptu speeches in order to develop our ability to think and speak quickly and effectively as leaders.

The third day of the Academy was perhaps the most valuable. We spent the majority of the day at the UBS office in Chifley Square - allowing us to not only engage with past Academy alumni but also UBS cadets who spoke to us about the opportunities and work that a career in investment banking held. Guest speaker Dr Catherine Keenan from the Sydney Story Factory also spoke to us about the importance of words, inspiration and leadership to enact even the smallest impact in society. Following this, we were given a tour of the UBS office, including the trading floor, allowing us to truly glimpse what it meant to work in an investment bank. Later on, we were also given a private tour of the Art Gallery of NSW, upon the conclusion of which we returned to the UBS office. In the evening, along with UBS cadets, employees and several high profile executives, we attended a canape networking function

in the UBS office. This allowed us to engage with different people and discuss different pathways to investment banking, cadetships and the importance of leadership.



The final day consisted of a session with the Foundation for Young Australians in which we discussed contemporary social issues which we wanted to tackle and formed pitches for videos to increase awareness. The Academy culminated in a graduation lunch at the Women's College hosted by the Secondary School's Principal's Association and marked the end of our four day journey.

Overall, the Academy was one of the most enriching experiences of my life

as a leader, and the friendships I formed and advice I learnt have been incredibly valuable. I highly recommend applying to any interested future female students and leaders in Year 11 - it's definitely a rewarding experience if you're interested in leadership.
