UNSW Economics and Business Studies Competitions

Earlier this year, our Year 12 and Accelerated Year 11 Economics Students and Year 12 and Accelerated Business Studies students participated in the University of NSW Australian Economics and Business Studies competitions.

Each year, over 6,000 Economics students and 8,000 Business Studies students from Australia, New Zealand, Singapore, Malaysia and Indonesia participate in these competitions. Once again, Baulko students performed strongly in both of these competitions, with 63% of students achieving a Distinction in the Economics competition and 60% of students achieving a Distinction in the Business Studies completion.

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These students have been invited to the official Awards ceremony being held at the UNSW campus in Kensington this month for achieving High Distinctions in either Economics or Business Studies. Furthermore, both Jeff and Aryan have been awarded monetary prizes of \$50 each for achieving in the top 2.5% of entrants.

Australian Geography Competition

Earlier this year all of our Year 9, 10 and 11 Geography students completed the Australian Geography competition, which involves over 70,000 entrants from across Australia.

Each year the two top performing Year 11 students from each state and Territory are invited to participate in the Geography Big Week Out. Cassandra Chen Year 11 is one of these top students and she has been invited to participate in this event.

The Geography Big Week Out is an all-expenses paid, six-day event held on Kangaroo Island in South Australia each year. During this week, students focus on fieldwork, spatial technologies and analytical skills. From this event, students are selected for the Australian teams who then go on to participate in the annual International Geography Olympiad, which was held in Canada this year and will be held in Hong Kong in 2019.

Unfortunately Cassandra has had to decline the invitation to the Geography Big Week Out being held these school holidays as she has already committed herself to the Economics Vietnam Study Tour being held at the same time.

However, we are extremely proud of Cassandra and congratulate her for her outstanding effort and achievement.

Tournament of Minds Sydney West Regional Finals 2018

Last Sunday, 26th August, 56 students from Baulkham Hils High School competed in the Sydney West Regional Finals for Tournament of the Minds. There were 58 teams competing in the regional finals, that's over 400 students in competition. Teams competed in two separate challenges, one of which they have 6 weeks to prepare a solution for, in the form of a 10 minute dramatic performance, and the other was an unseen challenge that they were given on competition day and had 5 minutes to creatively solve it as a team in front a panel of judges. Baulko competed across all four categories (Social Science, STEM, The Arts and Language Literature), with multiple teams in each of those categories.

To prepare for the tournament, teams have been training since the beginning of the year, they have been spending two hours after school every week in training, they have spent the majority of their lunch times together for the last 6 weeks, spent weekends rehearsing and given up an enormous amount of their own personal time preparing for tournament. A lot of hard work, stress and effort went into each team's preparation for tournament, and I can tell you that it absolutely paid off for them. All eight teams presented fantastic solutions to their challenges and really demonstrated abstract and innovative thinking. Not only that, but teams supported each other throughout the day, even when competing against each other – they still went and cheered their competition on, which is a testament to the camaraderie and respect these students have forged this year. Their conduct and efforts last weekend certainly did Baulkham Hills proud. As their facilitator I could not be prouder of the effort they have contributed this year – I really am so lucky to be able to watch these students push their limits, try new things and exceed even their own expectations. Once again, it has been an honour to work with them all this year!

This year was particularly bittersweet, as we had a number of Year 10 students completing their last year of TOM this year. Many of these Year 10 students have been doing TOM with me since they were in Year 7. I have had the utter privilege of watching the grow into the exceptional, mature and resilient leaders they are today. These Year 10 students have shown unrivalled passion, perseverance and resilience for the past few years, and this year have led their teams superbly – showing their juniors the true meaning of great leadership. I thank these Year 10 students for making my job such a delight for the past four years, and for having such a profound impact on myself and all those students fortunate enough to work with them.
