### **NESA Rewards Design and Technology Students**

This year Erik Lo Nielsen has been selected to display his HSC Major Design Project at the Shape 2018 exhibition. The Shape exhibition, held in the Powerhouse museum each year, showcases a selection of outstanding Major Projects from the HSC Design and Technology and other Technology courses. The aim of the exhibition is to discover innovative projects that will shape the future of Australian design. The projects selected utilise a range of materials and technologies. As varied as they are creative, these projects provide a glimpse into the minds of tomorrow's designers.

Erik designed and constructed his own innovative 3D Printer. The Printer is based on a delta design where the printing bed, and thus the object being printed, moves in three dimensions while the printing head remains stationary. Erik was able to apply this extensive skills in 3D printing developed during year 11, to 3D print the necessary components required to construct his printer. He also applied practical workshop skills developed in technology mandatory to machine the brass components on the lathe and milling machine. Furthermore he had to accurately configure the rotation of electric motors to control the movement of the bed and the rate of flow of the polymer being ejected from the printer head. In addition to designing and constructing a fully operational prototype, Erik was required to document each step of the project from the initial identification of the need, through to on-going evaluation and his extensive project management. Erik is to be congratulated for the successful completion of such an ambitious project and the recognition by NESA for excellence in design.
